TIME	ACTIVITY
	INTRODUCTION
	Re-cap on what you saw and did at Port Arthur – these activities are designed to re-call what the students have learned and see what they have understood.
	Use the Teacher Notes, which have the basic information about Convict Brick Making, to prompt students' memories.
	Choose one or all of the activities to finish off the lesson. Select an activity to suit your age group and their skill level.
	Activity 1 - 'WHAT CAN WE REMEMBER?'
	Using Activity Resource 1, work with the students to remember the steps they went through to create their brick – these can be written on the board as the class brainstorms together. Students then draw and/or write the process on the template provided.
	Activity 2 - 'BUILD A CONVICT BRICK WALL OF KNOWLEDGE'
	Print out enough copies of Activity Resource 3 for each student to have one brick.
	Make sure you have enough room on a notice board or wall to be able to stick all the bricks up to form a wall.
	 Hand out the bricks so each student has one brick Brainstorm facts the students are able to remember, writing them on the board Now ask the students to each choose one fact and write it one their brick in bold letters When they have completed the task, assemble the bricks to form a Convict Brick Wall Remember to leave gaps between the bricks to represent the mortar – use a mortar coloured paper as the background if you like Remember – it is not meant to be perfect!



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TIME	ACTIVITY
	Activity 3 – FACT RECALL
	Using Activity Resource 4, discuss the trip to Port Arthur and what they remember from the brick making activity. You can brainstorm this on the board with them.
	 Work with the students to remember the steps they went through to create their brick – these can be written on the board as the class brainstorms together. Ask the students to complete the question sheets (use the Teacher Notes to check their answers).
